Dear Administrator Nadeau,

I write in support of concerned constituents who wish to preserve a vital piece of South Jersey history in the Borough of Bellmawr, Camden County.

The Hugg-Harrison-Glover House, which sits along Browning Road at the site of New St. Mary Cemetery dates back to the 1700s and has ties to the American Revolution. Thousands of my constituents have signed petitions urging preservation of the Hugg-Harrison-Glover House, led by historians with the Camden County Historical Society.

An important highway infrastructure project along Interstate 295 in Bellmawr known as "Direct Connection," which I support as a necessary investment in our local infrastructure, leaves the future of this historic landmark unclear. As such, it is my understanding this matter has been brought to your attention by historians and others wishing to preserve the House.

I respectfully urge the Federal Highway Administration review the recent findings of the Camden County Historical Society and duly consider their proposal to relocate and preserve this piece of local history. I am also urgently requesting a meeting with your office so that we may review the proposal together and determine how to work collaboratively to save this venerable structure.

I urge those who can facilitate a plan to preserve the Hugg-Harrison-Glover House in Bellmawr to pursue all options at their disposal. This house links us to our past and we must give all due consideration to the history that helped shape the community we enjoy today.
